Wildcat Athletic Booster Club Academic Scholarship

The Estero High School Athletic Booster Club will award up to ten \$500 college scholarships to Estero High School seniors who meet the following Eligibility and Award criteria. All Scholarship applications must be submitted by April 1, 2012 at 2:00pm to Athletic Director's Office. Application packets with eligibility and criteria information are available in the Athletic Directors Office, through Guidance and on the Estero Website. Deadline for submission is April 13 at 2:00PM.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Students must be a senior at Estero High School with at least two years participation in an athletic program.
2. Applications must be filled out completely by the applicant.
3. Students must submit two letters of recommendation:
*One coach reference
*One personal reference
4. Students must submit a 500 word essay expressing how their participation in Estero High School athletics has benefited him or her.
5. Students must show proof of acceptance into an accredited college, university, community college or technical/trade school.
6. Students must have an overall GPA of 3.0. Scholarship applications must be received by April 1, 2012 by 2:00 to the Athletic Director's Office.
7. Students must complete 6 volunteer hours at a Booster Club event or Concession during football, soccer, baseball, softball, lacrosse or wrestling. (Contact a Booster Club Officer, Coach Sommer or stop by a concession stand to make arrangements.)
8. Awards will be based on academic and athletic achievements, essay content; grammar and composition, and the coach and personal reference.
9. Essays will be judged by an independent organization, i.e. Optimists Club or Rotary. . Up to ten scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$500.00 each. Scholarship money will be forwarded to the school of the applicant's choice; the funds will be unrestricted to be used for the 2012-13 school year.
10. Any disciplinary issues will be taken into consideration.
11. Recipients of scholarships will be awarded at the Senior Awards Night.

EHS cross country girls repeat as State Champions

After sweeping the Lee County Conference title as well as the state district and regional championships the EHS girls faced a real challenge from Tallahassee Chiles, winners of the last three 3A Cross Country Championships as they returned to Little Everglades Ranch in Dade City on November 19th. It was a real team effort as Chiles placed three runners in the top 5 but Estero then put the hammer down and placed six girls before Chiles could get their number four and Estero's number seven finished ahead of Chiles' number 5 propelling the Wildcat Girls to their second consecutive FHSAA State Championship and an undefeated season, this time in the 3A Classification. The Estero Seven were Junior Kacy Smith (8th), Sophomore Bethany Jenkins (11th), Junior Katie G. Solis (12th), Junior Mia Frank (20th), Sophomore Katie Slater (30th), Junior Aja Curth (44th), and Sophomore Alexa Cline (50th). The girls were ranked as high as 20th in the National polls and will look to make their mark next season as all the girls will return and a trip to the national cross country championships in Portland, Oregon, sponsored by Nike is a real possibility. The girls also fielded a very competitive JV led by Senior Joey Story, Freshman Meg Slater, Junior Katy K. Solis, Sophomore Ashley Sommer, Freshman Antonella Valencia and sophomore Heather Gunns.

EHS cross country boy's finish 3rd at State Finals

Expectations were high for the boys after last year's state championship season followed by a track 4x800 state championship in the spring. They struggled much of the season to find their form from last year while competing at top venues like Deja Vu (Tampa), UF Mountain Dew invite (Gainesville), and FLRunners (Titusville), winning districts but finishing runner up at the Regional Championship. They redeemed themselves at Little Everglades Ranch at the state finals finishing just points away from a runner-up trophy in the very difficult 3A class and were the highest placing team from Southwest Florida. The boy's state effort was led by Senior Aaron Rojas (10th), Sophomore Adam Sommer (21st), Senior Julian Chavez (39th), Junior Jose Cartegena (40th), Junior Steven Briner (54th), Junior Alex Hernandez (115th), and Sophomore Ricky Ledesma (123rd). Senior Alex Vasquez also ran some varsity races this season and the JV team included promising runners in Senior Efred Lopez, Freshman Dylan Vallette, sophomore Dillion Gamblin, Freshman Christian Slater, Freshman Evan Saylor, and Juniors Daniel Pava, Luis Almanza and Scott Davis. Coach Jeff Sommer noted this year's teams were the largest Estero HS has ever fielded and the girl's championship was the 6th state title recorded by Estero's Cross Country teams.

EHS teacher becomes finalist for golden apple

Notification of the presence of asbestos-containing materials in the school

To the Chairperson of the Parents Teachers Association and the Students of Estero High School:

These materials are being controlled in accordance with the Asbestos Management Program for the School and following the limitations and procedures of the policies and requirements of the Asbestos Operations and Maintenance Program of the School District of Lee County.

The report listing the location, quantities, and condition of all known materials and contains the details of the control procedures is available at the school office for your inspection during normal school hours. Copies of the whole or parts of the school's asbestos file can be supplied to you at a cost of \$0.15/page.

Test it Out!

FEBRUARY 28TH FCAT Writing will be administered to all tenth (10) grade students on Tuesday, February 28th. This is a required writing assessment by the state of Florida and is graded on a scale of 1 to 6. FCAT Writing is only given in the sophomore year and the student's score stays on their permanent transcript that is sent to colleges. FCAT Writing scores are considered as entry requirements for academies such as Cambridge, Travel and Tourism, and Medical. Additionally, scores of 4 and above are considered essential for placement into AP and AICE coursework. EOC*- End Of Course state required assessments:

APRIL 10TH FCAT Reading and Math retakes will begin for those juniors, seniors and/or adults still needing to pass either the Reading or the Math.

APRIL 16-20TH FCAT 2.0 Reading will take place for all students in Grades 9 and 10.

APRIL 23RD EOC's in Geometry and Biology will be held from April 23 through May 11. Estero High School will also be field testing the U.S. History EOC, but scores will not be released due to the field test status. That test will also run from April 23 through May 18.

APRIL 30th EOC for Algebra I will be held from April 30 through May 18th.

*EOC's must be completed in the order of Geometry, Biology 1, and Algebra 1. All testing for a single subject must be completed before the next subject may begin. Testing for a single subject may not exceed two weeks.

Since these tests are required by the state of Florida and several of them are graduation requirements—please ensure that your student will be present for all required testing. Should you have any questions, please contact Sandra Duttko, testing coordinator, at 947-9400, extension 222.
