**Key Club:** Key Club is the oldest student service organization in the country and is a branch of Kiwanis, an adult service club. At EHS our club meets on Thursdays. Dues are \$25 for the year and includes a t-shirt. Service opportunities are offered almost every week. We have offered almost 60 hours since the beginning of this year. A member has to pay their dues, attend as many meetings as possible, participate in discussion in the meetings when asked, participate in service hours that are provided (as often as possible), and keep track of their hours (although we keep track of them as well).

**Model UN:** Model U.N. is a club where students take on the major roles of the U.N. and solve major issues for the world. We participate in debates and conferences with students all over the state.
